Approaches to drafting legislation and policies for the social economy in African, Caribbean and Pacific countries

ABOUT THE ICR FACILITY

The ICR Facility is co-funded by the European Union (EU), the Organisation of African, Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS) under the 11th European Development Fund (EDF), together with the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and the British Council. It is implemented by GIZ, the British Council, Expertise France, and SNV.

The ICR Facility supports specific and targeted interventions at the economy-wide, sectorial and value chain level with Technical Assistance for up to 90 days based on requests. Requests can be handed in by OACPS public and private stakeholders according to the eligibility requirements. The ICR Facility offers Technical Assistance in the field of Business Environment Reform for inclusive and sustainable economic development on the basis Public-Private Dialogue.

As momentum builds across African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries to enhance support for the social economy, this live event will explore some of the legal and policy approaches that are being developed to foster its growth. Featuring social economy experts, the event will draw on the lessons learned from two ICR Facility interventions in Jamaica and Ghana, as well as from other initiatives supported by the European Union and other actors, exploring impactful strategies for developing a legal framework and drafting national policies that accelerate the development of the social economy. This, in turn, can help foster a more inclusive and sustainable business environment, address social and environmental challenges, and improve livelihoods, notably for those disadvantaged in the labour markets.

The event will include the presentation of the intervention in Jamaica which supported the Ministry of Industry, Investment and Commerce (MIIC) and the Planning Institute of Jamaica (PIOJ) in drafting new legislation to provide a distinct legal form for social enterprise, as well as the development of a national social enterprise marketing and resource mobilisation. The second featured intervention, presented by the head of Social Enterprise Ghana, draws on public private dialogue to update the draft Ghana Social Enterprise Policy and develop an action plan for its adoption and mainstreaming in the country.
